# Sewer Rates:

\*If more than one family or commercial unit uses the same water meter, the minimum monthly fixed sewer charge is \$30.11 per unit plus the average at the above rate.

# Insufficient Fund Check Charge:

A charge of \$10.00 will be added to the customer's account when a check is returned for insufficient funds.

# **Reconnection Charges:**

\*\*These charges are applied per utility that is in need of reconnection.

# **Billing:**

Bills for electric, water, sewer & refuse service are rendered monthly and become due and payable upon issuance following the period for which service is rendered. A late payment charge of 3% but not less than \$0.50 will be added to bills not paid within 20 days of issuance. This one-time 3% late payment charge will be applied only to any unpaid balances for the current billing period's usage. This late payment charge is applicable to all customers. The utility customer may be given a written notice that the bill is overdue no sooner than 20 days after the bill is issued and unless payment or satisfactory arrangement for payment is made within the next 10 days, service may be discontinued pursuant to WIS. Admin. Code ch PSC 113 & 185.

# 2nd Water Meter Purchase:

Second water meters are available for the purpose of metering water that will not be directed into the public sewer system.

Initial Charge \$300.00 (includes installation inspection by Village personnel)

# Bulk Water / Temporary Meters:

All bulk water supplied from the water system through hydrants or other connections shall be metered, or at the direction of the utility, estimated. Utility personnel or utility-approved party shall supervise the delivery of the water.

Bulk water sales are:

- 1. Water supplied by tank trunks or from hydrants for the purpose of irrigation or the filling of swimming pools; or,
- 2. Water supplied from hydrants or other temporary connections for general service type applications.

A charge for the volume of water used will be billed to the party using the water at a rate of \$3.44 per 100 cubic feet. A hydrant charge of \$25.00, in addition to the volumetric charge, will be added to bulk water sales. Temporary meters assigned to customers for the purpose of irrigation will be charged a monthly service fee of \$10.93 per 30-day period. Temporary meters assigned to customers for the purpose of filling a pool will be charged a service fee of \$10.93 (limit of 2-days usage).
